The IAA is an independent judicial body that was constituted under the Immigration Acts of 1971, 1993, and 1996 for the purpose of considering appeals of persons refused entry, refused extension of visit visas, and of persons seeking asylum into the United Kingdom.

As a fee paid Interpreter Zleta Heller is employed on a freelance basis to assist in the efficient, economic and effective hearing of appeals against decisions made by the Home Office on the subject of immigration. Her work consists of interpretation for Adjudicators and parties for the appellant during a hearing in Court. From time to time she is required to carry out translation or checking of the same in the course of her attendance at the IAA.

IAA interpreters, like all other persons employed by the United Kingdom Government, owe duties of confidentiality and loyal service to the Crown. These duties require the exercise of care in the use of information acquired in the course of official duties and the protection of information which is held in confidence. All Interpreters are required to understand and abide by the obligations of the Official Secrets Act 1989.
